A: To engage pupils in sports and fitness through high quality equipment, teaching and CPD.	Teaching is effectively planned to target all pupils' abilities and build on their start points. Lessons are engaging and teaching evidences a strong subject knowledge to provide high quality sports teaching. All teaching of PE is considered good or better.	Monitoring from First Steps identified that all teaching was at least good. Any areas to be addressed were quickly targeted and followed up. It was identified that further CPD for staff would be advantageous as through survey staff indicated they had training needs in PE. In addition a planning scheme in which to provide staff a basis for progression was identified as a further way to enhance outcomes in sport.
B: Children understand the importance of healthy lifestyles and how exercise contributes to achieving this.	Children can discuss lifestyle choices and understand the benefits and importance of exercise. Children can make informed choices about their lifestyle and can articulate this to others.	Through the monitoring of pupil voice children were able to identify ways to keep themselves healthy. This work has led to the establishment of a 'mile a day' to further enhance physical fitness each day and a play leaders club to continue the work of the healthy school input. Time has been invested into creating a new PHSCE curriculum that focuses clearly on these outcomes to ensure this remains a priority for the school.
